This is a fun, visual program that mixes some of the most exciting moments in movie history with an educational primer on special effects, explaining some of the ways that filmmakers have used technology and illusion to make the impossible seem real for over a century. You'll never watch a Hollywood blockbuster the same way again!

SUMMARY: *Kaboom: the History of Special Effects* traces the history of visual effects in movies, from early efforts in the late 1800s to today's computer-enhanced creations. As audiences have grown more sophisticated, so has Hollywood's arsenal of smoke and mirrors,

always aiming to take viewers into another reality.

Following a timeline through movie history, the program presents key effect moments from great movies, explaining how the effects were achieved and why each was an important advancement.
